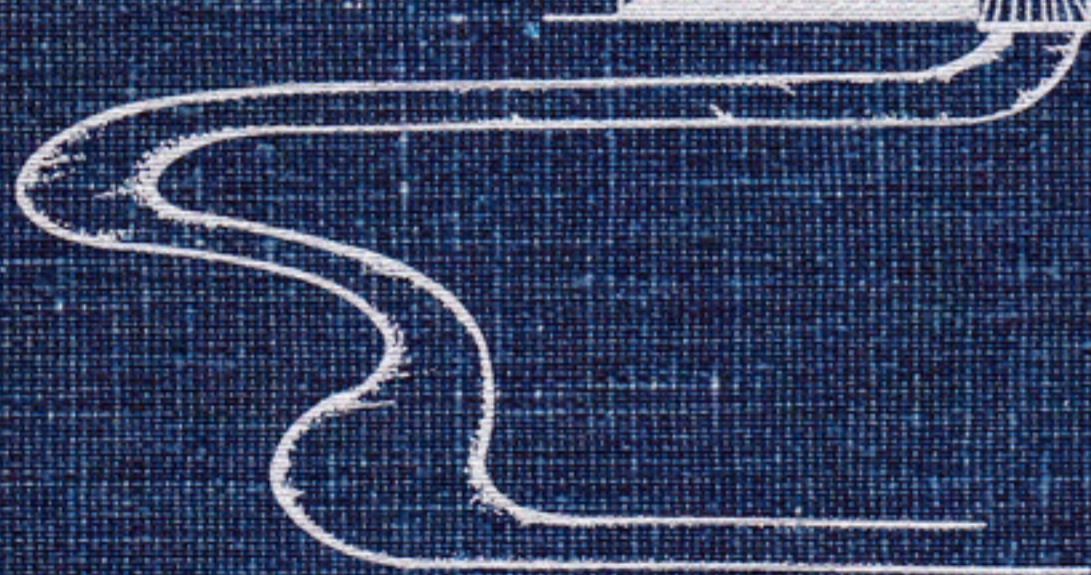

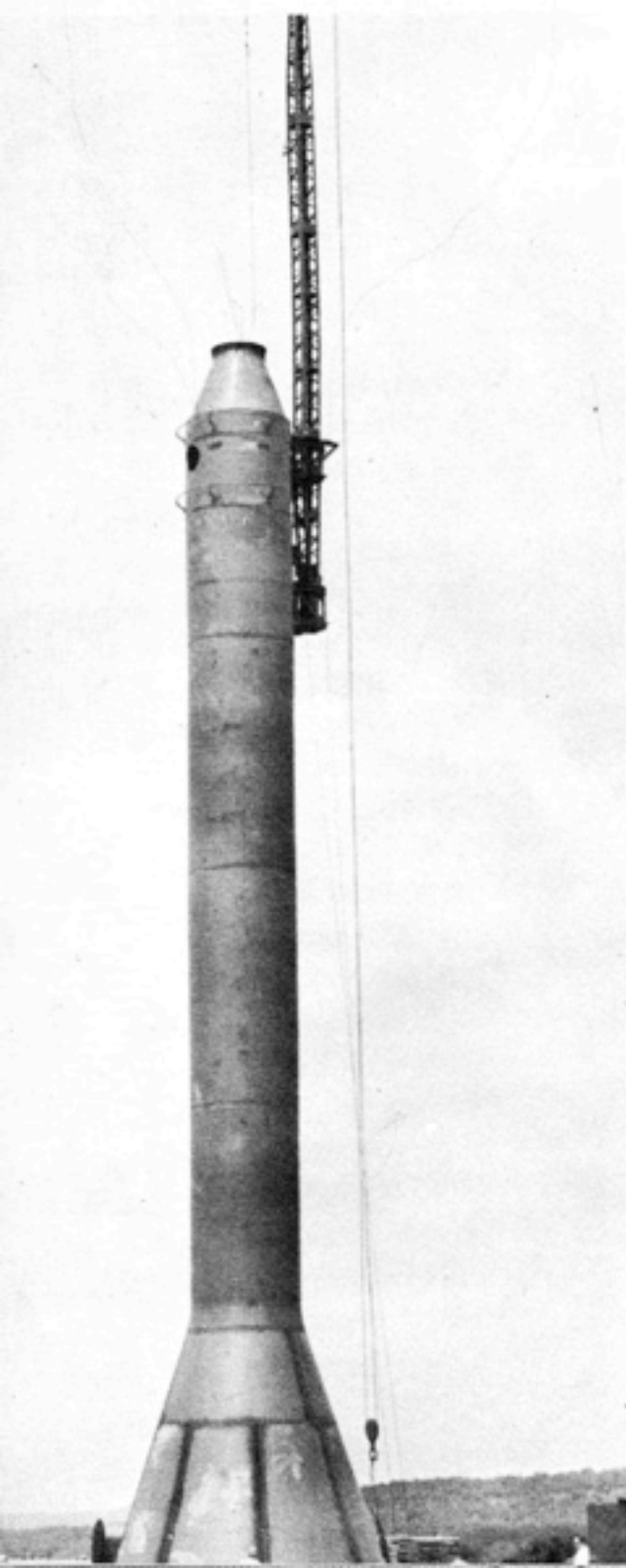
On July 19, 1958, the Southern New England Conference voted to build a secondary school separate from the college campus.

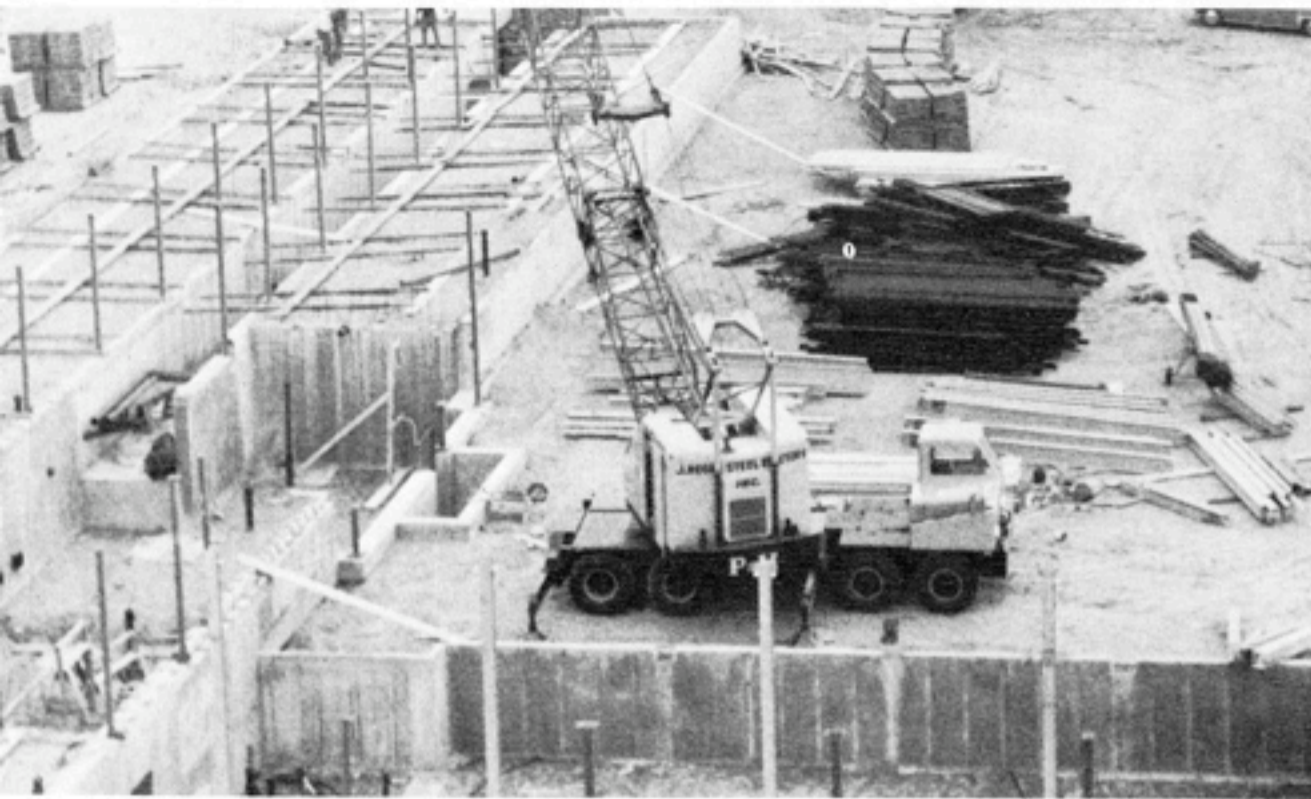
The ground-breaking ceremonies were held on July 2, 1961, for the construction of the first campus building -- the cafeteria.



The cafeteria under construction (above picture) here, was the first of the three main buildings to be completed.

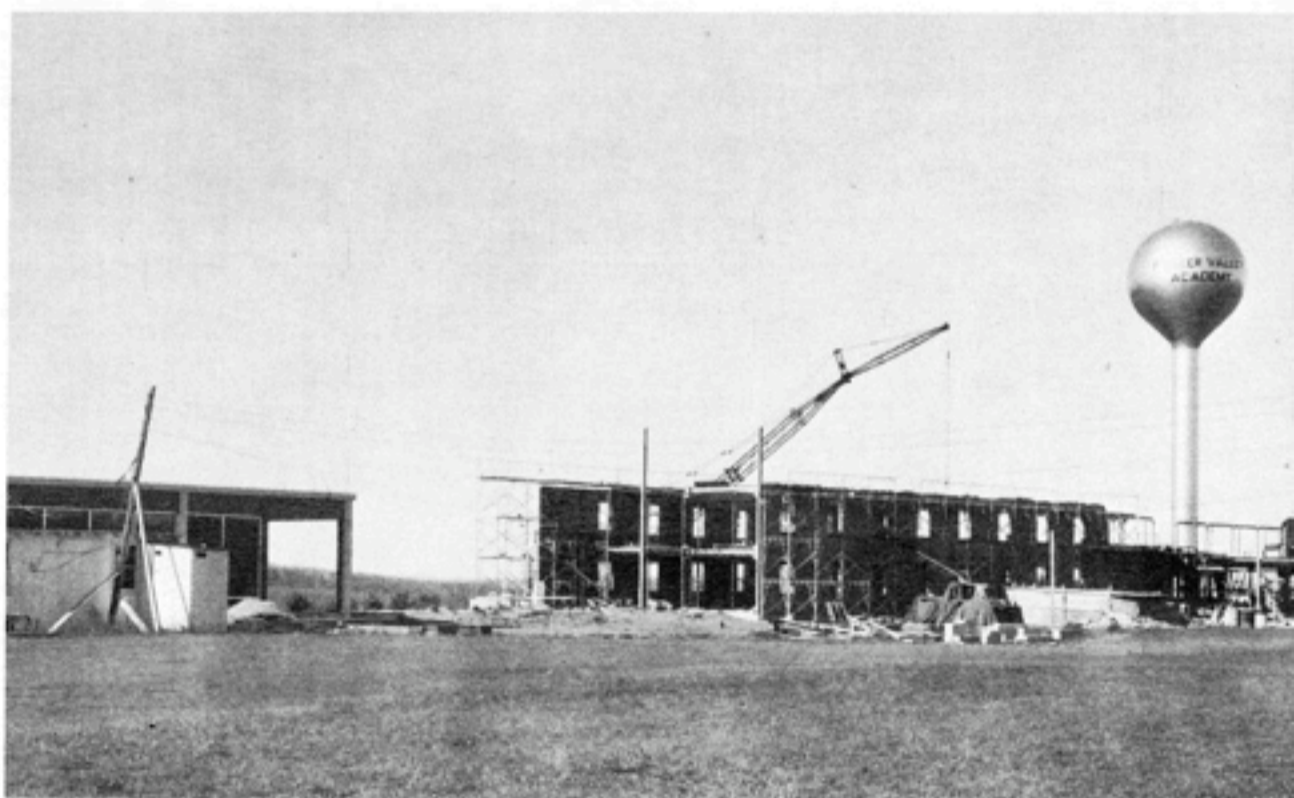
The completed water tower will have 150,000 gallons capacity.
